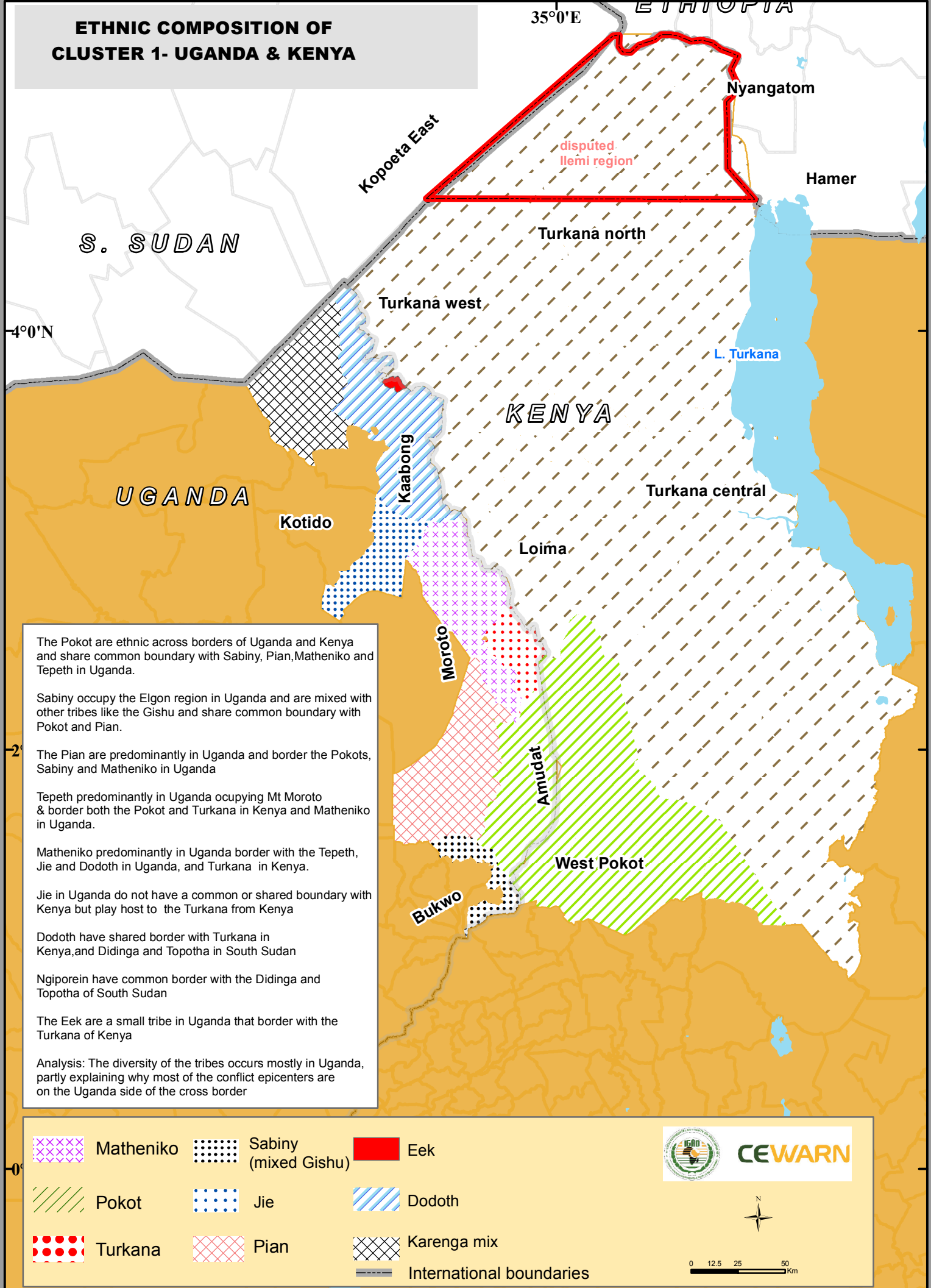


ETHNIC COMPOSITION OF CLUSTER 1- UGANDA & KENYA



The Pokot are ethnic across borders of Uganda and Kenya and share common boundary with Sabiny, Pian, Matheniko and Tepeth in Uganda.

Sabiny occupy the Elgon region in Uganda and are mixed with other tribes like the Gishu and share common boundary with Pokot and Pian.

The Pian are predominantly in Uganda and border the Pokots, Sabiny and Matheniko in Uganda

Tepeth predominantly in Uganda occupying Mt Moroto & border both the Pokot and Turkana in Kenya and Matheniko in Uganda.

Matheniko predominantly in Uganda border with the Tepeth, Jie and Dodoth in Uganda, and Turkana in Kenya.

Jie in Uganda do not have a common or shared boundary with Kenya but play host to the Turkana from Kenya

Dodoth have shared border with Turkana in Kenya, and Didinga and Topotha in South Sudan

Ngiporein have common border with the Didinga and Topotha of South Sudan

The Eek are a small tribe in Uganda that border with the Turkana of Kenya

Analysis: The diversity of the tribes occurs mostly in Uganda, partly explaining why most of the conflict epicenters are on the Uganda side of the cross border
